Internships

The selected candidate will work under the direct supervision of Wildlife Learning Center Staff members to get a better understanding of care and management of exotic zoo-born and rehabilitated animals used in conservation education.

Guidelines

- Candidates must be at least 18 years of age.
- Currently enrolled and working towards a biology related science degree.
- Must be able to lift and carry 40 lbs.
- Must have a professional appearance, no visible tattoos or excessive piercings.
- Must be flexible as work shifts are highly variable.
- Must be able to work outdoors in potentially inclement weather.

Description

This internship is non-stipend, 3 months long and a minimum of 3 days per week, including weekends. Our interns gain supervised, hands-on experience under the guidance of WLC employees.

- Assemblies and community presentations
- Birthday parties
- Camp (seasonal)
- Veterinary care
- Diet preparation and feedings
- Animal care
- Enclosure and grounds maintenance
- Keeping active records of animals' health and behavior
- Greeting general admission guests while the park is open to the public
